General Report

The SWO continued its tradition of efficiency this academic year. All the events of previous years were conducted with renewed vigour. New additions this year include the introduction of the Patriotic Song Competition and Grand Christmas Show into the University and SWO calendar.

The Cultural Team changed the out station fest to IIT Chennai instead of BITS Goa and out of 32 events participated, we bagged 26 events with multiple prizes. Apart from that, they also won various college fests within the city and other places like NIT Trichy etc. The Christ University Cultural team has also put up cultural performance at the Christ Institute of Management, Lavasa Campus for the second time which turned out to be a huge success and got appreciation from the people there. The Christ University Cultural Team and the Volunteer Team have grown to its biggest since its inception, with 150 and 350 students respectively.

'Blossoms' and 'In Bloom' continued in their tradition by providing zest and colour to the campus, with all deaneries participating enthusiastically in Blossoms, especially the Dance Extravaganza, and many colleges, both from within and outside Bengaluru, participating in In-Bloom 2017.

Inauguration of Academic Year 2016-17

As is the university custom, we commenced the academic year with the inaugural function comprising prayers of the various religions, to symbolize our secularism and hope for the upcoming year. To keep our students in good guidance, the inaugural function included a message from the Vice Chancellor, wherein the optimization of library use was stressed upon. The university has a lot to offer to its students in terms of associations and clubs like NCC, CSA (Centre for Social Action), ACC (Association of Christian Christites) and so on (SWO included). The working of such associations was introduced to the students to guide them with their choices to contribute to holistic growth. Following this, specific departmental orientation for all the newly-inducted Christites was conducted. This helped to familiarize the students with the university culture and ideals, coupled with their departmental norms and practices.

Freshers' Quiz

The Christ University Quiz Association (CUQA) launched their activities for the year with the 'Freshers' Quiz' which started in June 2016. As rightly suggested by the name, the quiz was open for participation only from freshers and was conducted in cycles, with one round held once in 2 weeks. New teams were allowed to enter the competition in every new cycle. After three such cycles, the top three teams from each cycle were brought together for the final round. The final round of the quiz was conducted in August and the quizmaster for the same was Anand Bhat (Ex-christite and head of CUQA for 2015-16).

Darpan 2016

Started in the mid-1990s to discover and tap into the talents of Christites, Darpan – the university-wide talent search was conducted. From then to now, the standard of talent at Christ University has only gone on excelling. This academic year was no less. The Darpan 2016 chapter started on July 4th with a grand inauguration and went over the entire month until 25th July 2016. The inauguration of Darpan was conducted in unison with the Pedagogic League inauguration of the Department of Sports. The star attraction of this inauguration was the flash mob initiated by the Department of Professional Studies, with participation from 1500 students.

Darpan aims to provide an opportunity to all the students of Christ University to showcase their talents individually or in groups. It is a platform where students from every 2016-17

stream in the University, undergraduate and postgraduate, take part to be selected to be a part of the prestigious University cultural team and have to chance to be the ambassadors of the University. As mentioned, the winners of Darpanform the Christ University Cultural team and represent the university in all the Inter collegiate/University fests conducted all over the country.

There were 32 events, ranging from Art, Literary, Stage and Theatre with over 5,000 enthusiastic participants. The Art events included painting, sketching, junk art, etc., the Literary events included debate, dumb charades, extempore, and quiz, and Stage events such as Indian Classical dance, Indian music, mime, Western electric music – just to name a few; Additionally, two major theatre events proscenium and street theatre were conducted.

The wheels started rolling long ago for this event to be a successful one. The promotions, plans and preparations were coordinated by the SWO and its team of Volunteers comprising 150 students. The volunteer body with the help of the coordinators executed all the events and held a flash mob to motivate the students for their participation in the fest. The participation from the students was in large numbers and around 390 winners were selected from all the events. The winners were then felicitated at the Darpan Valedictory Ceremony held on August 31stby the Chief Finance Officer Fr. Varghese. They received certificates and gift vouchers from Sapna Book House.

The winners then became a part of the University cultural team, chosenthrough a cumulative points system. Darpan 2016 fulfilled its purpose byhelping bring to light the budding talent within all corners of the University. The event-wise report of Darpan 2016 is as follows:

Patriotic Song Competition

In the month of August, to augment the Independence Day celebrations, SWO conducted a patriotic song competition that saw enthusiastic participation from 11 teams across the University. The event was added newly to the SWO event calendar and will continue to be conducted with the accentuated excitement in the years to come. The competition was conducted on 27th August 2016, in front of the Central Block stairs. The competition was judged by Mr. Sunil (Performing Arts Department faculty) and Ms. Gayathri (Christ Junior College faculty). Apart from the various courses, teams were also formed by the student associations like CSA and NCC. Placing first in this spirited event was the 2nd year team from BA. The BBA team placed second, followed by the team from Performing Arts.

Teachers' Day Celebrations - GurubhyoNamaha

The university has always upheld the importance of a 'Guru' in guiding the students towards growth. In a rightful tribute to the dedicated teachers of our university, Teachers' Day was celebrated on September 3rd, in the main auditorium. The function started with a special classical dance performance by the Natyaarpana, centered on the theme 'Significance of Guru according to ancient texts and beliefs'. The awe-inspiring performance was coupled by a serene rendition by the University Choir. Due to prior commitments, the Vice Chancellor could not attend the celebration. However, a video message from the Vice Chancellor was played wherein commensurate gratitude for the service of the faculty members was expressed.

BhashaUtsav& Ethnic Day

September 17th saw the cultural diversity on campus displayed through the celebration of 'BhashaUtsav'. Organized by the Department of Languages, BhashaUtsav and Ethnic Day is one of the most awaited events on campus. The Department of Languages is assisted by the SWO volunteers, who check the ID cards of all entrants, and aid with crowd management for the event.

Blossoms is an Inter-Deanery Cultural Fest at Christ University. A total of 9 Deaneries are formed across the 3 campuses of Christ University. Blossoms is a forum for these deaneries to battle it out and have the opportunity to be crowned the best deanery in the University. True to this idea, Blossoms' tagline is "Be the Best" – encouraging not only each deanery to be the best, but encouraging every Christite to be the best version of themselves. It happens at two levels: level 1 is intra-deanery, wherein each deanery strives to find the best talents within the deanery to represent them at the later stages. The first level of Blossoms takes place simultaneously in all three campuses of the University over a 3 month period (November – January). Level 2 of Blossoms is inter-deanery, wherein the deaneries engage in healthy competition to establish themselves as the incredibly best on campus. This takes place in the first week of February, alongside another incredibly popular Inter-Collegiate National Level Cultural Fest "In-Bloom".

Not only taking the form of a spirited competition, Blossoms also aims to unify the entire University by providing a platform to motivate every single Christite to participate in at least one event in the university, if not more, for now. The idea is to bring out the best within each individual for their deanery, which ultimately builds within them an overall feeling of belongingness.

Blossoms features around 36 events at both levels, divided into Stage, Art, Literature and Theatre events. The three months of Blossoms see the campus bustling and almost bursting with full energy among all Christites, and animating the campus with an extremely lively, festive atmosphere. The most awaited event of Christ University in Blossoms is the Dance Extravaganza. In this event, we will have a minimum of 25 dancers in a team, and no maximum limit. Every year, we have seen that the event more than lives up to its name – sometimes entire deaneries come together to dance to the tunes of Indian film songs which is a feast for the eyes.

Blossoms 2016-17 was inaugurated on 7th Nov 2016 at 12 noon in the main auditorium, Christ University. The Chief Guest for the event was Dr. Fr. Thomas C Matthew, the Vice Chancellor of Christ University who also gave the inaugural address. The inauguration featured performances by the Choir, Natyaarpana and the Cul-team, as well as a performance from the Banerghatta Road campus dance team. A team of around 35 volunteers

helped in decorating the place and controlling the enthusiastic crowd in order to ensure the smooth completion of the event.

Blossoms finals were conducted between 2nd and 4th February, 2017. The Christ University Faculty of Engineering won the overall prize of Blossoms 2016-17.

National Quiz Championship

The National Quiz Championship for the year 2016-17 was held on 25th and 26th of November. There were nine finalists. There were fifty one teams from Christ University and eighteen teams from other colleges for the prelims. The Open Quiz was open to all students and members from corporates as well. The Quiz Masters for the events were Major Chantrakanth Nair, a retired army personnel, and Sameer Dharur. The event was conducted by forty two SWO volunteers along with fifteen Quiz Association members.

Magnificat

Magnificat is a music festival that was conducted and hosted by the Christ University Choir on 2nd, 3rd, and 4th December 2016, in the main campus and the Kengeri campus. It never fails to bring the true Christmas spirit home - the entire university reverberates with the soulful music and spirit of magnanimity.

The Christ University Choir renders splendid harmonies and performs complex pieces that bring to mind images of tranquillity and joy. Different choirs from across the city join and perform along with the Christ University Choir. The CUFE choir, Christ University postgraduate choir, Christ Junior College choir, and the MPE choir also performed.

Annual Athletic Meet – Sports Day

Christ University organized a two day sports day for Christ junior college and Christ PU college, inaugurated on 2nd December 2016 at Dharmaram Basketball court. The inauguration ceremony began at 12 noon. The Chief Guest for the day was Shri Arjun DevaiahTheethamada, an International Athlete, Student Counselor, Mentor and anEkalavya Awardee. The Annual March Past competition for the year 2016 began by the band of Kengeri Campus followed by other classes from PU and ended by Christ University NCC and Brass Band. Then the invocation song was performed by Christ Junior Choir Team. The welcome address was given by Dr Anil Joseph Pinto, Registrar of Christ University, followed

by Vice Chancellor Col. Dr. Fr. Thomas C Mathew addressing the gathering and the Chief guest addresses and declares the meet open, after which all the sportspeople present took an oath. The inauguration was ended by a dance performed by the University Dance Team and the University Anthem.

Grand Christmas Show

Introduced for the first time in the Christ University and SWO calendar, the Grand Christmas Show was aimed at bringing some yuletide cheer to the campus, a bright memory for the students to take home with them on the Christmas vacation. Held on 19th December 2016 in front of the central block, it featured performances by the Natyaarpana, University Choir, Department of Performing Arts, and the MPE (students of Music, Psychology, and English) choir.

In-Bloom 2017

In-Bloom is a national-level cultural festival organised annually by Christ University. It features stage, art, literary, and theatre events. In-Bloom aims to provide a platform for students from institutions across the country to channelise their creativity, sharpen their minds, and exhibit their talents within an atmosphere of amity and celebration.

Preparations for In-Bloom 2017 began as early as September 2016, with publicity and designing. Pre-invites were sent out early, and the final invitations and posters were sent December onwards. Invites were personally handed over by a team of volunteers and cultural secretaries to Bangalore colleges, and subsequently followed up with.

The theme for In-Bloom 2017 was Evolution of Art Forms. The arts are a defining mark of the human race; they distinguish us from all other creatures and bring us closer to divinity. The plethora of arts - the melody of music, the texture of written text, the display of dance and drama, and the spectacle of sketches and paintings - signifies the highest expression of human creativity. The theme for In-Bloom this year celebrated this facet of human life - one which fills our world with colour and meaning - the evolution of art forms from the origin, the wonderful growth, and the abundance that is yet to come.

With collaboration between the volunteer body and the cultural team, In-Bloom was conducted between 1st and 4th February 2017, alongside Baptizer – Theatre Festival and Blossoms finals. Although Baptizer is organised by the Theatre-in-Education department, the SWO volunteer body provides assistance through crowd management and MCing. As per Christ University tradition, free accommodation and registration were provided to all teams,

with attractive cash prizes. Around 30 institutions participated in the fest, and the overall trophy was won by Jain University, Jayanagar, Bengaluru.

In-Bloom was concluded with the pro show – a performance by Bryden&Parth, a musical duo, in collaboration with the Choral Riff in the main auditorium. They performed a number of crowd-pleasers, and kept the audience well-entertained.

Nritta - Dance Day

Nritta is the University's annual dance day. With over 400+ dancers performing, it is a delight to the senses that no Christite would want to miss. The auditorium is always packed on the days of the event, the audience bursting with as much enthusiasm as the performers..

Held on March 2nd, 4th, and 5th, Dance Day featured mesmerising performances that were nearly two hours long, held for 3 days in succession. It began with the performance in the Kengeri campus, followed by two days of the same event in the Christ university main campus auditorium. The theme for this year was PanchaTattva. Christ University embraces the idea that anybody can dance in full spirit. Although the university dance team Natyaarpana, delivers the majority of the performances, students from across the university are encouraged to be a part of this event. Nritta this year featured nearly 650 dancers, from all three campuses of the University in the city. SWO volunteers provide support for the event in the backstage and with crowd management.

Gratitude Day

Christ University Volunteer Body: 2016-17

As in the previous years, the Student Volunteers of the SWO continued to successfully organise several university events from May 2016 to March 2017. The Faculty in-charge for SWO volunteer body for the year was Mr Bhaskar and Mr SoorajSekhar. There was an Orientation for all the SWO Volunteers at the Kengeri Campus on August 6th and 7th. The orientation was conducted by Mr. Jayakumar who is an expert in conducting such sessions. A total of 17 studentsapplied for the certificate course from the volunteer body and successfully completed the course.

The activities of the SWO Volunteer Body began in May 2016 by helping the Office of Examination in organizing the Convocation 2016. In the beginning of June, the SWO Volunteer Body joined hands with the University to welcome the freshers, second year students and the final year students to the University (both UG and PG). The registrations for the different wings of SWO were opened in the first week of June. We witnessed an overwhelming response of about 1000 volunteers registering within the week itself. Darpan 2016, the cultural competition of Christ University was an awaited event in July.

The Volunteer Body was headed by Jibin Sam Philip of III BCA, Shaleen Wilson of III PSEco and Rohan Kumar of III PSEco.

Events organized by the Volunteers:

"DARPAN", the annual talent search programme, was inaugurated on July 4th in the Football ground along with the Pedagogic league and was flagged off by Rev. Fr Thomas C. Mathew. This marked the beginning of all the cultural events. SWO volunteers arranged all the requirements for the programme and maintain decorum while the event was going on. Darpan provided a highly motivating environment and a wide platform for students coming from all streams. It covered competitions in the cultural disciplines of arts, dance, music, theatre and literature over a span of three weeks. All these events were conducted and managed by the SWO volunteers with the assistance of SWO staff co-coordinators.

The Volunteer Body also helped the Department of Kannada in audience and back stage management for the annual Yakshagana performance "Guru Dakshina" on 20th July.

On September 5th, SWO celebrated Teachers Day, "GurubhyoNamaha". This event took place in the Main auditorium. The invites for the programme were made by the SWO

volunteers. The dance team Natyaarpana and the Choir staged an exclusive performance for the teachers.

September 17th saw the cultural diversity on campus through the celebration of 'BHASHA UTSAV' organized by the Department of Languages and was also assisted by the SWO Volunteer Body.

The month of November marked the beginning of one of the most awaited events in the University, 'BLOSSOMS - Be the Best'. The inauguration was held in the main auditorium with performances by the Choir, Natyarpana and the Cul-team.

The National Level Quiz Championship took place on the 24th and 25th of November. It witnessed over 200 College teams and 30 Corporate teams. The volunteers helped the University Quiz Association in arranging all requirements for the Championship and also took charge of Auditorium and back stage management.

'MAGNIFICAT: A song of Hope', the annual Christmas Choral Festival, was held on the 2nd and 3rd of December in the Main Campus and 4th December in the Kengeri Campus. The event was organised by the University Choir with the volunteers assisting in crowd management and hospitality. It took place in the Main Auditorium and witnessed the participation of numerous Choirs. The family and friends of the students were seen attending the event along with the staff of the University.

The month of February witnessed a lot of events which made the campus alive with energy and colours. The annual cultural fest 'IN-BLOOM 2017' was based on the theme 'EVOLUTION OF ART FORMS'. It was held between 2nd and 4th of February and was a combined effort of the Cul-team and the SWO volunteers. The finals of Blossoms took place simultaneously where various deaneries were seen battling it out with each other to win the trophy for the best deanery in the University. This year, the trophy for BLOSSOMS 2017- 18 was won by the Faculty of Engineering, Christ University, and that of IN-BLOOM 2017 was won by Jain University, Jayanagar, Bengaluru.

'NRITTA', the University Dance Day was held on the 4th and 5th of March in the Main Campus and 2nd March in the Kengeri Campus with around 650 dancers of the University performing to put up a spectacular show for all. The volunteers assisted in

managing the crowd, maintaining discipline during the event and complete back stage work. The Student Council Induction programme was also held on the 4th of March.

The end of the academic year was marked by Gratitude Day which was held on the 17th of March. The student volunteers assisted in distributing bookmarks, caps as well as ensuring that all the students were present in their respective positions.


