ORIGIN OF CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC COLLEGES OF KARNATAKA (CCCK)

was on the steps of Vilhjalmur Southa, Bangalore that CCCK was born on 16th October 1977. Rev. Fr. Ignatius Pinto and Rev. Fr. Denis Norohna, Minorcan Secretaries for Education, Bangalore and Mysore, respectively, were on their way back, distraught from the office of the Education Ministry along with the Advocate J.A. Soeque after presenting a memorandum. The memorandum was a plea to delete certain clauses in the agreement between the Government of Karnataka and the Private College Management for the direct payment of salaries to the staff.

The demand was never conceded by the government but the CCCK got head start on a purposeful note. It then formulated its Alma & Objectives:

To foster fellowship among all the Catholic Colleges of Karnataka and promote their common interests
To discuss topics of mutual interest and take appropriate action to implement the conclusions arrived at

To safeguard and revere the rights conferred upon Catholic Colleges under Article 30 of the Constitution as a religious minority and to take concerted action whenever necessary

policy through adequate judgement, analysis and recommendation on the draft, National Policy on Education (NPE)-2016

The draft NPE 2016, envisaged by the Ministry of Human resources and Development (MHRD), with respect to the preamble, methodology, analysis and recommendations aims at improving the state of education in the country. This initiative of the MHRD though focuses at site changes in the education sector, it draws our attention from responsible constituents (segments) of the society especially the minorities. Hence it is essential that they respond and communicate their aspirations in this process of nation building and for the cause of education in general. The CCCK National workshop on the National Policy on Education (NPE)-2016 – Prospects and Aspirations is called to discuss, debate and draw up a response and to make a representation to the MHRD before the NPE 2016 is finally evolved and officially drafted.

OBJECTIVES OF THE WORKSHOP

- To enable leaders develop awareness and an understanding of the draft National Policy on Education (NPE) 2016
- To equip educational leaders to discuss and discourse the draft National Policy perspectives and implications for Higher Education
- To develop strategies and response by the Minorities with regard to their Rights and Aspirations in the context of the National Policy on Education 2016 and the changing context of higher education
- To initiate institutions to review, evolve and implement strategies through the recommendations & declaration of the workshop in line with future trends that may impact higher educational institutions
